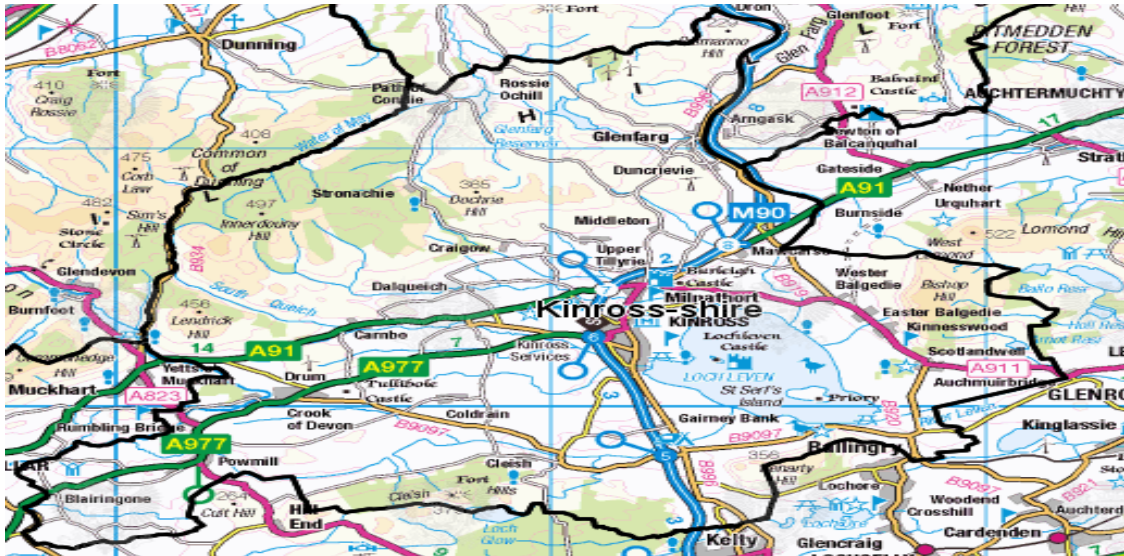

The 'Kinross-shire Decide' project is organised by the Kinross-shire, Almond and Earn Action Partnership and the Perth and Kinross Health and Social Care Partnership.



What is Participatory Budgeting (PB)?

PB enables residents to decide how public money should be spent in their communities. The Scottish Government supports PB as a tool for community engagement and to build on the wider development of participatory democracy in Scotland. It is funding local projects to investigate the benefits for increasing community participation and getting services to put the needs of the community at the heart of their planning.

What is the funding?

The Kinross-shire, Almond and Earn Action Partnership has been set up to tackle inequalities in the area and to help services and communities work better together.

The Action Partnership and Health and Social Care Partnership have a joint fund which the communities of Kinross-shire can spend on community-led projects.

What can you apply for?

You can apply for up to £2,000 to pay for, or help pay for, projects that will:

- *respond to neighbourhood priorities and address local inequalities;*
- *benefit as many people as possible from across the community;*
- *meet a need that is not currently being met;*
- *take place before end March 2019.*

There is no minimum amount.

Who can apply?

We are seeking ideas from community groups and not-for-profit organisations that help contribute towards the Partnership's objective of tackling inequalities. Projects should address local priorities such as providing activities for young people, employment and training, community transport, access to local services and activities, or reducing the inequalities associated with health and social care, social isolation, poverty, age or disabilities.

How do you apply?

Please return this form by **26th January 2018**. If your idea matches the criterion of tackling inequality, you will be invited to present it with a stall at the Better Place to Live Fair, Loch Leven Community Campus on the 3rd March 2018. The public there will vote for the projects they think should receive the funding. Details of the event will be sent to applicants meeting the criteria.
