foresaids at their expense on all necessary occasions upon a receipt and obligation to redeliver the same within a reasonable time and under a suitable penalty and we assign the rents and we bind ourselves to free and relieve our said disponees and their foresaids of all feu duties and public burdens but not casualties and we grant warrands but excepting always from this warran- the current t---s and leases if any affecting the said subjects and we assent to registration hereof for preservation witness whereof these presents consisting of this and the preceding page and including the Relative Inventory page third hereof are subscribed by me the said Mrs Ann Mailler or Dunlop of Paisley on the twenty fourth day of May Nineteen hundred and four before these witnesses Arthur Graham Dyer Paisley and Malcolm Hart Labourer there and by me the said Mrs Helen Mailler or Stark at Kinross on the twenty seventh day of said month and year last mentioned before these witnesses Alexander Ferguson and Alexander Henderson both Clerks to Robert Storer Young Solicitor Kinross (signed) Helen Stark Ann Dunlop Alexr Ferguson Witness Alexander Henderson Witness Arthur Graham Witness Malcolm Hart Witness _____
